Who we are

The African Organization for the Development of Centers for Persons with Disabilities (OADCPH), is a unique non-governmental organization (NGO) in Africa. It was founded in 2011 and is based in Togo, West Africa, since 2012. OADCPH is recognized as a public utility NGO by the Togolese government, with which it signed a program agreement in 2015 and a headquarters agreement in 2018.

OADCPH was created to strengthen the rehabilitation ecosystem in Africa. OADCPH's actions aim to facilitate access to assistive technologies for all, including the most vulnerable.

Our Mission

To promote access to low-cost assistive technologies to a greater number of people with disabilities in Africa in a sustainable manner.

Our goals

- To help improve the quality of care in the field of disability in Africa
- To promote the sustainability of rehabilitation facilities in Africa
- To ensure a reliable and secure supply of rehabilitation components, equipment and assistive products in Africa
- To support and strengthen the capacities of stakeholders working in the field of disability in Africa.

What do we do?

1. Supporting access to Services (Promoting access to services for the most vulnerable people with disabilities)

In the socio-economic context of low-income countries, it is difficult for the majority of people with disabilities to access even the most basic rehabilitation care and assistive products because of their precariousness.

Thanks to its central purchasing office and its partners, OADCPH participates in the management of the most vulnerable people with disabilities by providing rehabilitation centers and professionals, associations working with these people with rehabilitation equipment and components. Some people also benefit directly from assistive products from the OADCPH purchasing central office.

What do we do?

2. Continuing education for rehabilitation professionals, service managers and administrative staff.

OADCPH is aware of the need to maintain and update the competences and skills of the different actors, professional or not, involved in the field of rehabilitation, so that they continue to provide quality services, and thus guarantee the sustainability of the rehabilitation centers.

Since 2013, OADCPH has been organizing continuing education courses for the different actors coming from the member countries and has today a catalog of more than 44 modules.

3. Technical advice and support for the development of services and technical issues.

OADCPH is committed to the development of centers for people with disabilities in Africa, and as such it offers its support and makes the different actors of rehabilitation benefit from its experience and resources.

4. Solution development and innovation

To overcome the multiple barriers that service providers face in providing quality services at an affordable price and the barriers faced in accessing services by people in need, OADCPH seeks to develop and implement new products, services, or business models and methods.

5. The central purchasing office

Thanks to its central purchasing office, the OADCPH makes available in Africa mobility aids, consumables, raw materials and rehabilitation equipment, by sourcing them from various international suppliers. It thus facilitates the acquisition to the different member rehabilitation centers and structures in the different African countries.

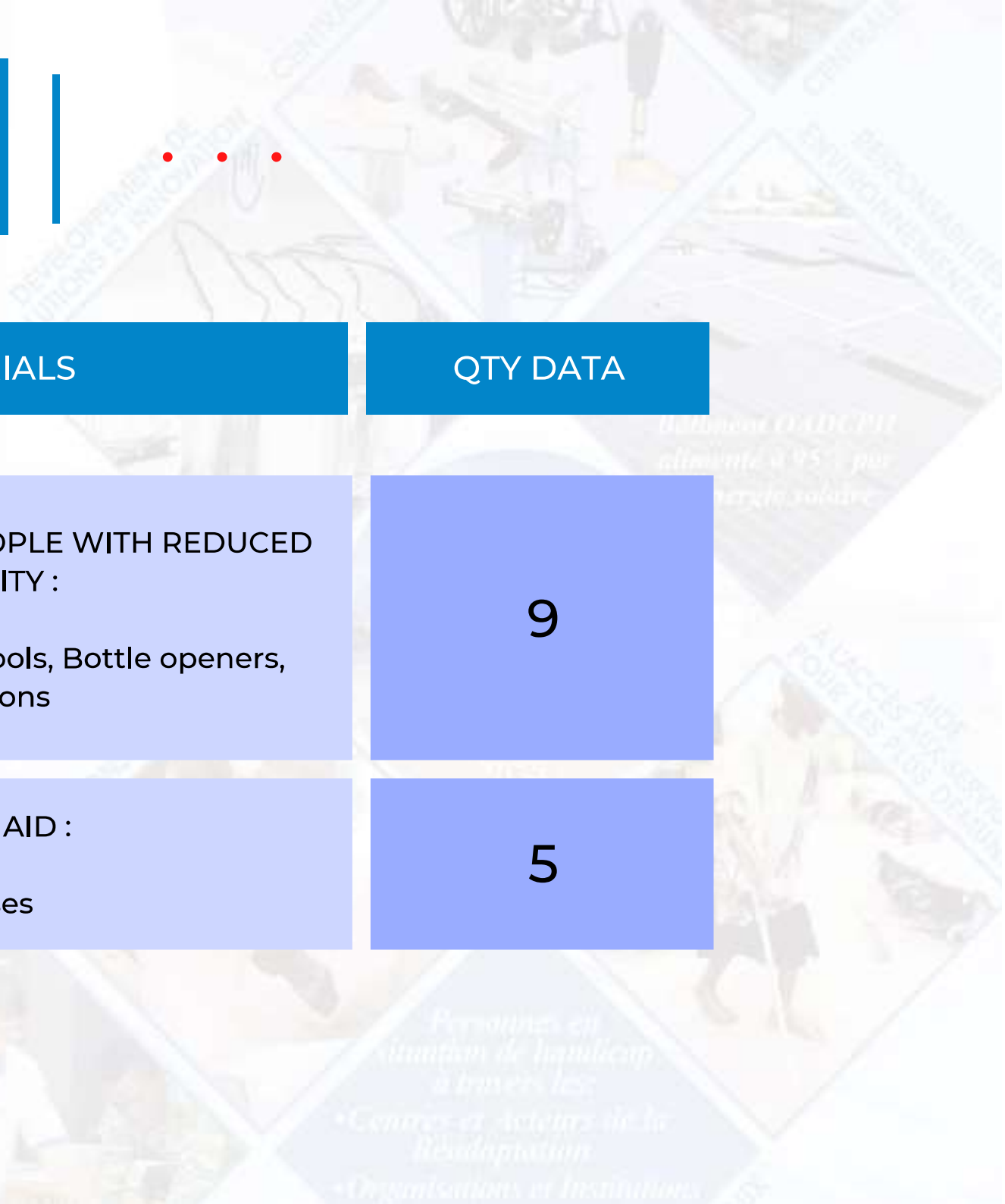

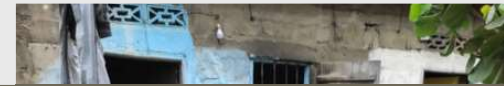


SABO Nanimpo, 12 years old

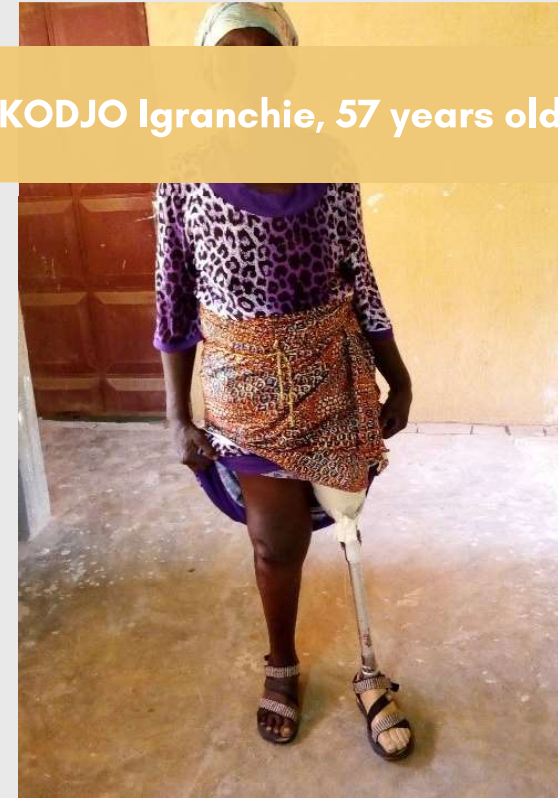
LARE Wangamin, 21 years old

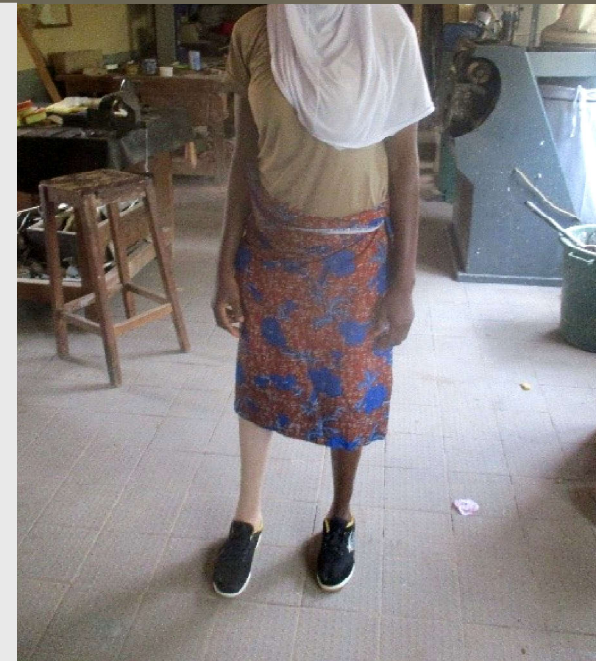

Story of Laté, a mechanic in Benin



Laté is a mechanic of large trucks and used to work as a mechanic in a public transport bus in Cotonou (Benin).

In 2017, he had an accident and had to have his left lower limb amputated.

He was able to get his first prosthesis in 2017 thanks to recycled components, but unfortunately he lost his job.

With his prosthesis, Laté never felt unfit. He continued to be active and was even rehired in a large garage in Cotonou. Very dedicated to his job, Laté was promoted to chief mechanic.

Thanks to his prosthesis, he remained dynamic, well-versed in his work, and virtually unaware of his disability, but his device has worn out over time and because of his work.

Without a new prosthesis, it is simply not possible for Laté to continue his work.

Story of John, a young Ghanaian



John, a 25-year-old Ghanaian resident in Accra, had his right lower limb amputated due to a congenital defect. To get around, John had to rely on makeshift means and this was not to improve his social status.

He now has a good prosthesis, and continues his walking training in Br. Tarcisius Prosthetics & Orthotics Training College (Ghana).

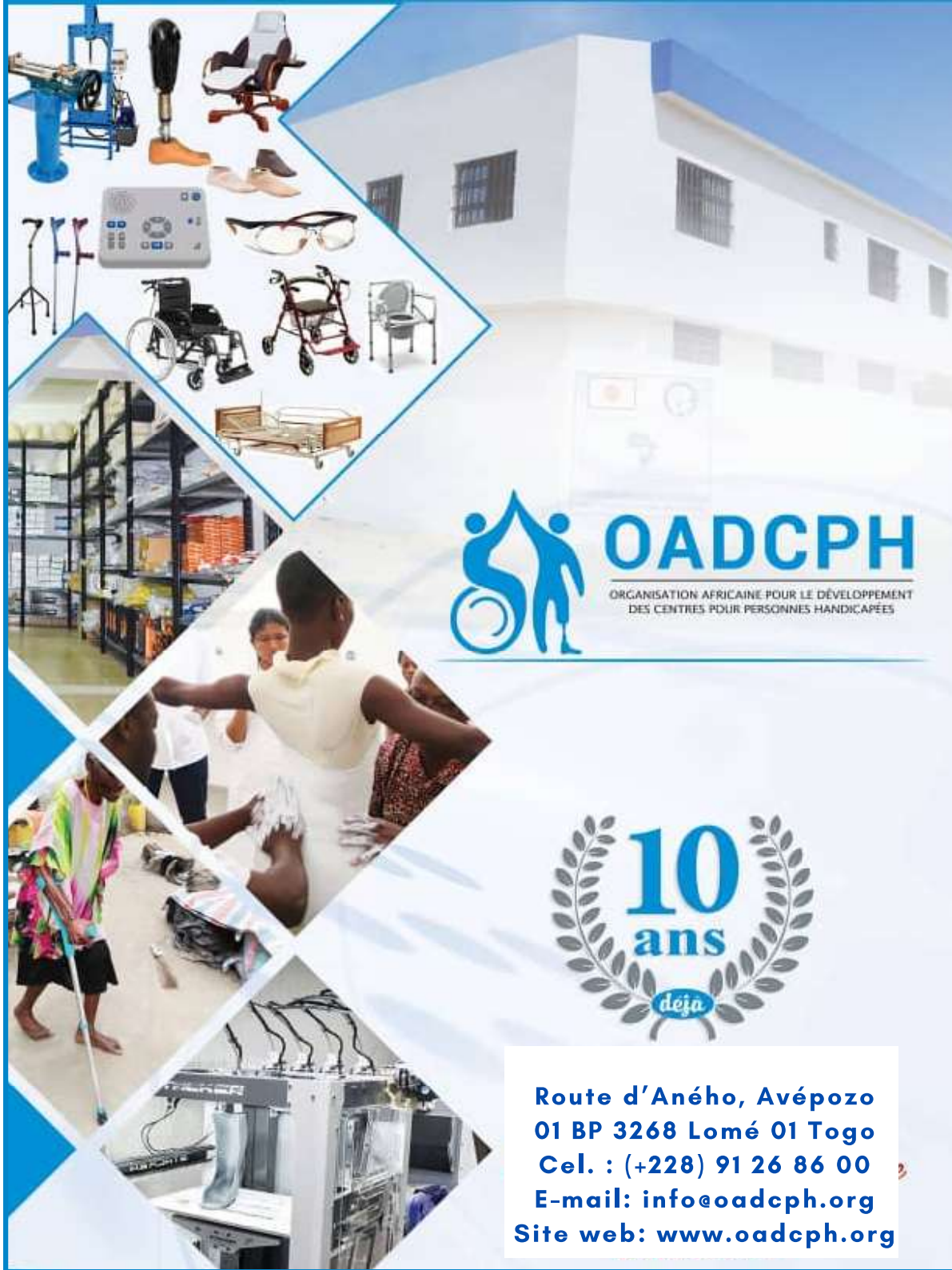
Why act with us?
